ORDINANCE 2006 - 3

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MONROE TOWNSHIP, SNYDER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, CREATING THE OFFICE OF TOWNSHIP MANAGER

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of Monroe Township, Snyder County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the authority of the same, as follows:

ARTICLE 1. Office Established.

The office of Township Manager is hereby created by the Board of Supervisors, subject to the right of the Board, by ordinance, at any time to abolish such office.

ARTICLE 2. Appointment; term; vacancy; removal.

A Township Manager (hereinafter referred to as "Manager") may be appointed for and by a majority of all the members of the Board of Supervisors (hereinafter referred to as "Board"), and he or she shall serve until the first Monday of January of the even-numbered year succeeding his appointment or until his successor is appointed and qualifies for office. In the event of a vacancy, the Board shall appoint a replacement by a majority vote of all its members for the unexpired term. The Manager is an at-will employee. The Manager, if appointed, shall serve at the pleasure of the Board and may be removed at any time by a majority vote of the Board. At least thirty days before any removal becomes effective, the Board shall furnish the Manager with a written statement setting forth its intention of removal.

ARTICLE 3. Qualifications, Compensation, Powers and Duties of a Manager.

The qualifications, compensation, powers and duties of a Manager will be established by the Board by resolution and are subject to modification at any time by the Board.

ARTICLE 4. Disability or Absence of a Manager.


If the Manager becomes ill or needs to be absent from the Township, the duties of the Manager shall be Performed during his or her absence by such person as may be designated by the Board.

ARTICLE 5. SEVERANCE CLAUSE - Should any section, paragraph, clause or phrase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of said Ordinance shall not be affected thereby, and shall remain in full force and effect.

ARTICLE 6 REPEALER CLAUSE - All ordinances or parts of ordinances or resolutions conflicting with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.






