

**MONROE TOWNSHIP  
ORDINANCE NO. 2011-2**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MONROE RESCINDING TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 24 WHICH CREATED THE MONROE TOWNSHIP RECREATION BOARD TO MAINTAIN, OPERATE AND SUPERVISE THE PUBLIC PARKS, PLAY FIELDS AND ALL OUTDOOR AND INDOOR RECREATION AREAS AND FACILITIES OWNED OR CONTROLLED BY MONROE TOWNSHIP and RESCINDING TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 1987-5 WHICH CHANGED THE COMPOSITION OF THE MONROE TOWNSHIP RECREATION BOARD TO ELIMINATE THE REQUIREMENT THAT CERTAIN BOARD MEMBERS BE MEMBERS OF THE SCHOOL BOARD.

WHEREAS, on January 7, 1970, Monroe Township enacted Township Ordinance No. 24 which Ordinance created the Monroe Township Recreation Board to maintain, operate and supervise the public parks, play fields and all outdoor and indoor recreation areas and facilities owned or controlled by Monroe Township. Township Ordinance No. 24 also included the requirement that certain board members be members of the school board.

WHEREAS, on April 14, 1987, Monroe Township enacted Township Ordinance No 1987-5 (which amended Monroe Township Ordinance No. 24), that changed the composition of the Monroe Township Recreation Board to eliminate the requirement that certain board members be members of the school board.


WHEREAS, the Monroe Township Supervisors, at their meeting of the Board of Supervisors on February 22, 2011 discussed Township Ordinance No. 24 and Township Ordinance No. 1987-5 and made the decision to rescind both Ordinances and passed a motion that Township Ordinance No. 24 and Township Ordinance No. 1987-5 be repealed.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED** by the Board of Supervisors of Monroe Township, Snyder County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

1. That Township Ordinance No. 24 and Township Ordinance No. 1987-5 are hereby repealed.
2. That all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.






