ORDINANCE 2006-2**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MONROE AMENDING  
ORDINANCE NO. 2003-2, BY UPDATING THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 1.  
STREET NUMBER REGULATIONS**

The Township of Monroe hereby ordains that Section 1. Street number regulations and Section 1-A. are hereby amended as follows:

**Section 1. Street number regulations.** The Owners of all buildings or structure/property within Monroe Township to which Street numbers have been assigned shall have the street number prominently displayed by December 31, 2006 and at all times thereafter in accordance with the following standards. For purposes of this ordinance a "Street number" is an address number established in accordance with the county wide 911 Public Safety System with reference to the adjacent road or street, assigned and given to a particular building or structure/property by Snyder County 911 and the United States Postal Service. For specific sections of roadways with an existing addressing system that is approved by Snyder County 911, the "Street number" is the retained street number in the existing addressing system that is established in conjunction with the County Addressing Project.

- A. Each building to which a street number has been assigned shall have a street number displayed upon the building, except for buildings which are located a distance greater than 200 feet from the nearest edge of the cartway of the public roadway or upon which signage cannot be attached which would be readable from the nearest public roadway by reason of natural or manmade obstructions. The owner of said structure/property shall be required to provide posted street number signage at a location near the edge of the cartway of the public roadway which will obviously indicate to emergency responders the street address of the owner's structure/property. The post shall not be in a location where a snow plow or other municipal maintenance activities will disturb it, and shall have affixed thereon at a height of not less than 4 feet or more than 7 feet the street number which has been assigned to the structure/property. Any property owner proposing to place a post at a distance greater than 30 feet from the nearest edge of the cartway of the public roadway shall obtain location approval from the Township prior to placement.


**Full force and effect:** All provisions of Ordinance 2003-2 that are not inconsistent herewith shall remain in full force and effect.

**Severability:** If any sentence, clause, section or part of this ordinance is for any reason found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such unconstitutionally, illegality or invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections or parts of this ordinance. It is hereby declared as the intent of the Monroe Township Board of Supervisors that this ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid sentence, clause, section or part thereof not been included herein.


**Effective date:** This ordinance shall become effective five days of its enactment.


